The Encounter (24:13-16; 18:31-34)

Two Devastated Disciples (13-14; 17, 19-24)

Jesus Identity Hidden (15-16, 19-24; 18:31-34)

Luke 18:31-34 Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. ³² He will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him, spit on him, flog him and kill him. ³³ On the third day he will rise again." ³⁴ The disciples did not understand any of this. Its meaning was hidden from them, and they did not know what he was talking about.

What are You Discussing? (17-18)

What Things? (19-24; 1-12)

What is the Problem? (25; 1-12; 19-24)

Stop Doubting and Believe (25-27, 1 Pet. 1:11; 1 Cor. 15:3-4)

1 Peter 1:11 trying to find out the time and circumstances to which the Spirit of Christ in them was pointing when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow.

1 Corinthians 15:3-4 For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,

At Table Fellowship their Eyes were Opened (30-32; 22:19; Acts 2:42)

Luke 22:19 And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.
